

BOARD OF ELECTIONS

Ritner Highway Building, Carlisle, PA
November 11, 2014 @ 9:00 a.m.

Present: Commissioner Cross, Hertzler, and Eichelberger were present. Larry Thomas, Chief Clerk; Keith Brenneman, Solicitor; Penny Brown & Bethany Salzarulo, Elections; Mark Adams, IMTO.

Call to Order: Commissioner Cross called the meeting to order.

Roll Call: Commissioner Cross, Hertzler, and Eichelberger were present.

Public Comment: None

Approval of Minutes: Commissioner Hertzler moved to approve the minutes of October 30, 2014. Commissioner Cross seconded the motion and it unanimously carried.

Approval of Provisional Voting Results: Commissioner Hertzler moved to approve the provisional voting results from Tuesday, November 4th, 2014. Commissioner Cross seconded the motion and it unanimously carried. A total of 134 provisional ballots were cast. Commissioner Cross asked if anyone called to find out about their ballot disposition. Penny explained that the number the voter is given to call is to the Department of State so we do not know if they call. Commissioner Hertzler asked what Partially counted meant. Penny explained that it was a voter who is registered in the County but did not vote in their precinct so only part of the ballot would count. For example: Governor would count but not the other offices. Commissioner Hertzler questioned if they lived in another district would they be allowed to vote if they showed up at another polling place. Penny explained that is what a partial count is. Commissioner Hertzler asked why people who thought they were registered in Shippensburg Township were not registered. Penny explained that college students are registered at the college then they registered at home and we have to go with the most current information. Election receives a phone call day of Elections to search for registration if the person isn't registered then we let the Judge of Election know that. He questioned when they get their driver's license could that change their registration back to their home address, Penny said yes it would if they asked to have it updated.

Approval of Cumulation of Write-In votes: Commissioner Eichelberger moved to approve the Cumulation of Write-in votes. Commissioner Hertzler seconded the motion and it unanimously

carried. Penny Brown explained that on page 2 of the write in document that there were two individuals running a write-in campaign, Ken Krawchuk & Henry Haller. No write in votes change the outcome of any of the offices on the ballot.

Authorize Submission of the Unofficial Results to the Department of State: Commissioner Eichelberger moved to approve authorization to submit the Unofficial Results to the Department of State. These were the unofficial votes for Tom Wolf and Tom Corbett. Commissioner Hertzler seconded the motion and it unanimously carried. There are 15 Military Ballots yet to be counted.

Other Business: Commissioner Cross stated she was asked on Election Day in West Pennsboro Township, why do they have to wait in line when there are seven machines but only three machines that are being voted on. Penny Brown stated that getting signed in at the Poll Book holds up the process. Commissioner Cross stated that the Election reform committee is trying to find a way to simplify the process.

Commissioner Eichelberger asked if there were issues with the road closure at Woods Drive. There was discussion regarding the process that was taken to open the road to residents on Election Day and that the Election Bureau had no phone calls or issues with it. Commission Eichelberger also mentioned an issue with Carlisle 4-2, between the Judge of Election and poll watchers and Penny said she would look into it.

Commissioner Hertzler questioned if there were any issues with moving Oyster Mill to West Creek Hills Elementary School. Penny said we had no issues from the voters. He asked if Elections received resident complaints who haven't voted since moving precinct. Penny said no.

ADJOURN: There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting adjourned at 9:20 a.m.
