CLAREMONT NURSING & REHABILITATION CENTER TO HOST COMMUNITY EVENT – 2nd ANNUAL FELINE ADOPTION FESTIVAL

Cumberland County, PA – The Claremont Nursing & Rehabilitation Center (CNRC) located at 1000 Claremont Road, Carlisle, (Middlesex Township) plans to hold a Cat Rescue Event on Saturday, March 25, 2017 from 10:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. Seven rescue groups will be on-site with cats and kittens for adoption. Nobody's Cats Foundation and Forever Love Rescues will offer affordable vaccines and micro-chipping for cats (in carriers) and dogs during the event.

Dr. Debbie Statland, DVM will administer the low cost vaccines.

- One-year rabies vaccine, \$10 each
- Canine or feline distemper/combo vaccine, \$10 each
- Three-year rabies vaccine, \$20 each (Pet owners must provide legal proof of previous year's vaccination to receive this vaccine.)

New this year to the festival is the option to Micro-chip pets, including the required micro-chipping registration for \$25 each.

The annual festival also includes many vendors, as well as food, entertainment, and games for children. The public is invited to attend this free event, which raises awareness and funds for local animal-welfare groups. All proceeds will go to the rescues. Monetary donations or any cat toys, cat food, cat litter, old blankets, sheets, and towels will be accepted and distributed to the rescue groups.

CNRC is pleased to host this event in partnership with two local non-profit organizations. The Nobody's Cats Foundation promotes the adoption of Trap Neuter Return (TNR) as the preferred strategy for humanely stabilizing and reducing free-roaming domestic feline populations in eight south-central Pennsylvania counties (Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Lancaster, Lebanon, Perry, and York). Forever Love Rescues focuses on rescuing, rehabilitating, and placing as many animals in need as possible, while educating the public on ways to alleviate the cause of pet overpopulation.
