


## Cumberland County Household Hazardous 2020 Facts

Cumberland County's Household Hazardous Waste Disposal Events have concluded for 2020. Collection events were held in June, August, and October (unfortunately an event scheduled for April had to be canceled due to the pandemic).

In summary, 964 customers dropped off 115,372 pounds (over 57 tons) of HHW for disposal. 88,739 pounds, or 77%, were paint products.

The program is funded by a combination of state grants (55%), user fees (30%), and sponsorships (15%). Survey responses for the 2020 HHW program were overwhelmingly positive.

Cumberland County will soon begin working with the regulatory agencies and contractor to establish and register collection events for 2021. A schedule will be released once finalized.
